

Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 3—Summer 1

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts with **speed and accuracy**.

I know multiplication and division facts for the 4 times table

Children should be able to instantly recall the 4 times table:

$4 \times 1 = 4$	$1 \times 4 = 4$	$4 \div 4 = 1$	$4 \div 1 = 4$
$4 \times 2 = 8$	$2 \times 4 = 8$	$8 \div 4 = 2$	$8 \div 2 = 4$
$4 \times 3 = 12$	$3 \times 4 = 12$	$12 \div 4 = 3$	$12 \div 3 = 4$
$4 \times 4 = 16$	$4 \times 4 = 16$	$16 \div 4 = 4$	$16 \div 4 = 4$
$4 \times 5 = 20$	$5 \times 4 = 20$	$20 \div 4 = 5$	$20 \div 5 = 4$
$4 \times 6 = 24$	$6 \times 4 = 24$	$24 \div 4 = 6$	$24 \div 6 = 4$
$4 \times 7 = 28$	$7 \times 4 = 28$	$28 \div 4 = 7$	$28 \div 7 = 4$
$4 \times 8 = 32$	$8 \times 4 = 32$	$32 \div 4 = 8$	$32 \div 8 = 4$
$4 \times 9 = 36$	$9 \times 4 = 36$	$36 \div 4 = 9$	$36 \div 9 = 4$
$4 \times 10 = 40$	$10 \times 4 = 40$	$40 \div 4 = 10$	$40 \div 10 = 4$
$4 \times 11 = 44$	$11 \times 4 = 44$	$44 \div 4 = 11$	$44 \div 11 = 4$
$4 \times 12 = 48$	$12 \times 4 = 48$	$48 \div 4 = 12$	$48 \div 12 = 4$

Top tips

The secret to success is practicing **little** and **often**. Can you practice this KIRF whilst walking to school or during a car journey? You do not need to practice all of the KIRF all at once. Practical ideas and resources:

- *TT Rockstars is a great way to practice times tables.
- To multiply a number by 4, simply double it and double it again.
- Chant the four times table together.
- If your child knows one fact (e.g 12 x 4 = 48) can they tell you the three other facts in the same fact family?
