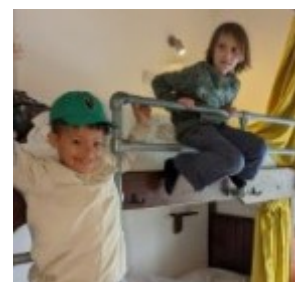

Please enjoy some of the many photos we took on camp, along with some comments from the children who attended: 'You gave us an incredible camp with adventures, pottery and seaside's'



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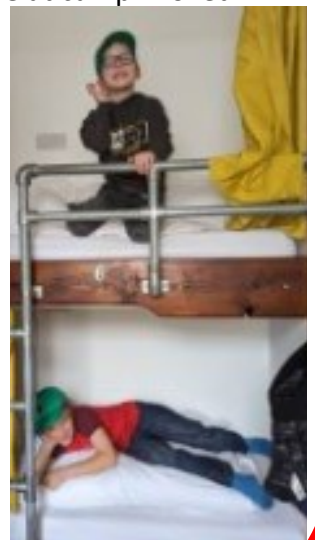
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'My favourite part was the walks around St Ives and listening to your facts about Barbara Hepworth, going to where she lived and seeing where Alfred Wallis lived'

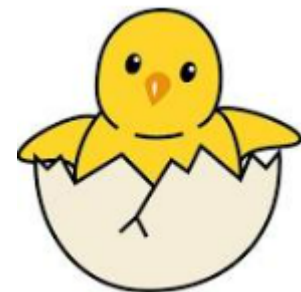

Easter Coronation Activities

The idea has been inspired by Constantine Arts Society who will be putting on a display of 2D and 3D crowns over the Coronation weekend in St Constantine Church, and also a story about King Charles visiting a local creek near Constantine just off the Helford River as a young boy, together with other members of the Royal family during the 1950s. The Royal Yacht Britannia was anchored in Falmouth Bay and the family came into the creek aboard the Royal Barge, they had a picnic, and did a bit of rowing about before heading back to Britannia! Can you guess where they were spotted?



The activity has three categories:

1. Write a short story. Title 'The Day the King Lost His Crown' but the final line has to be: '.....and there it was,in Constantine!'
2. Draw (A4) or make a Crown. Materials should be either recycled or natural from woodland or hedgerows.
3. On a postcard with one side decorated beautifully fit for a King and the other side an answer to the following questions - What Constantine/Cornish gift could we give to a King? Why would you want the King to have this gift?

You are allowed one entry per category. That means you can, if you wish, hand in three pieces of work. Please put your name and age on your work.

There will be a small prize for the best in each category. The winning story will be published in the Const Times and go on the Coronation web page for Constantine.

All work will be displayed alongside the 2D and 3D crowns in St Constantine Church over the Coronation weekend 6th-8th May 2023.
