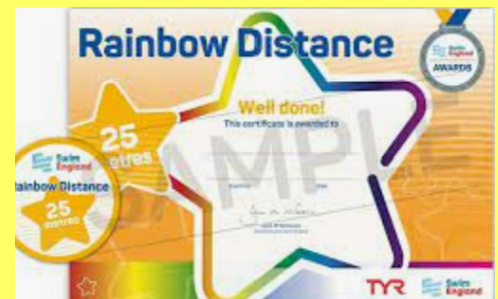
Thank you for supporting our new end of day routines. We feel that has made the end of the school much calmer.

Cosmic Kids

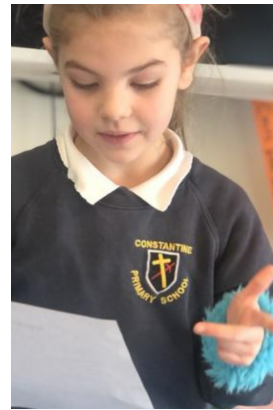


Children in Year 1 have been learning Cosmic Kids Yoga since the start of the school year. They love it!
