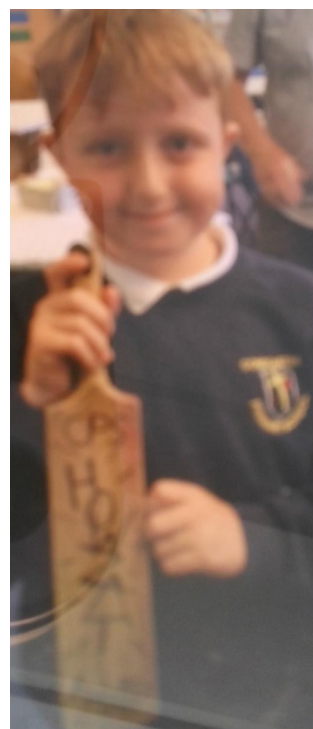

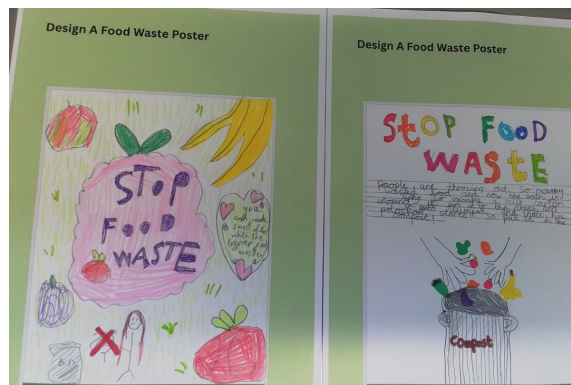


Waste Warriors

Resin Animals

Recently, children across the school have been enjoying bringing in small resin animals to play with at break and lunchtime. It has been lovely to see the imaginative and creative ways the children have played together, building habitats, homes and even whole villages for the animals.

However, more recently, some children have started to “trade” the resin animals with one another and this has unfortunately caused some issues, with a number of children going home upset. We have also had some problems with animals getting lost in school.

This week, we have explained to the children that they may still bring up to five resin animals into school to play with at breaktimes and lunchtimes, but they must be kept safely in bags at all other times. We have also made it very clear that no trading of the animals should take place.

Teachers have explained that if these new rules do not prevent further issues with trading and lost items, we may have to stop the resin animals from being brought into school altogether.

Please could we also ask that children do not bring the animals into school in glass jars, as these can easily break and could cause injury.

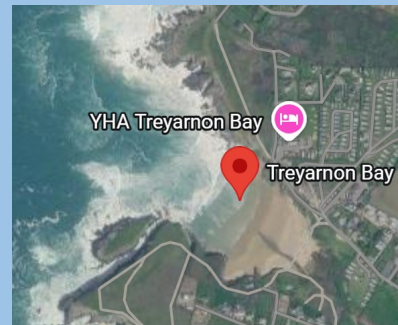
